A Letter From The Pastor

Martin Luther wrote, "Faith and love should be distinguished in this way; faith is concerned with the person and love with the works... Faith justifies but it does not fulfil the law; love does not justify but it fulfills the law; the law demands love and works but does not mention the person; the person feels the law, but love does not feel it at all. Faith, then, although it cannot fulfill the law, yet possesses that by which the law can be fulfilled, for it gains the Spirit and the love by which it can be fulfilled... To sum up, as St. Paul himself here says, "Love is the fulfilling of the law," as if

he said that it is one thing to fulfill the law and another to make possible the fulfilling of the law. Love fulfills the law in the sense that it is itself the fulfilling of the law, but faith fulfills it in the sense that it provides the doer and love remains the deed."[1]

His words channel those of St. Paul in his letter to the Romans, "Love is the fulfilling of the law" Romans 13: 10, as well as those of James, "You see that faith was active along with his works and faith was brought to completion by the works" James, 2:22.

Here we see Luther grapple with our Christian essence through Law and Gospel. "Faith, love and works" are the words that he uses to understand what it is that we do in response to God, and what we should be doing in faith. The law is fulfilled by love, this we know; for Jesus is the essence of God's love for the world, and fulfilled the law for us, because of our inability to do so on our own.

Faith holds the potential for fulfillment of the law, but fails to do so alone and without love (and the Spirit). Faith is a catalyst, of sorts, for love to enter and then for the law to be fulfilled, but it is love (Jesus) that fulfills, not faith (trust). If we trust, we will know love and love will lead us to works.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions About Stephen Ministry - Part 4

Stephen Ministry is a worldwide ministry with roots in St. Louis. It was started in 1975 by Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, Ph.D., a pastor and clinical psychologist, who at the time was pastor of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church. Fresh out of seminary, Dr. Haugk quickly discovered there were many more needs for care than he alone could meet. He drew on his background in theology and psychology and trained nine parishioners to assist in pastoral care. It was so successful that other churches became interested, and the Stephen Ministries organization was founded. Today, more than 11,000 congregations from 160 denominations are involved. Most are in the United States and Canada, but there are also Stephen Ministry churches in 24 other countries.

The people cared for by Stephen Ministers benefit greatly. They are receiving support and encouragement in their time of need. Stephen Ministers benefit tremendously too. "I've really grown spiritually and deepened my prayer life since I became a Stephen Minister," said a Stephen Minister in Illinois. "This has helped me to be a better mentor to the men I minister to. I became a Stephen Minister to help someone else, but I found that I have grown a lot too," said another Stephen Minister. "It's an amazing experience to see God work through you to change the life of another person." Pastors recognize the positive effect Stephen Ministry has on the church's ability to reach out into the community. As one Pastor stated: "Stephen Ministry is a very concrete way that we share the love and hope of Jesus Christ as we fulfill our vision."

Soon there will be the recruitment of additional Stephen Ministers at Advent. This is an opportunity for you to join the team and experience exceptional training covering topics such as; caring ministry, assertive relating, spiritual gifts discovery, grief support, and spiritual growth. Use what you learn to improve your ability to relate to and care for others, grow in faith, and journey through life crises.

You are invited to join our Stephen Ministry Team. Do you have the desire to help another person struggling with a life crisis and unsure how to help? The Stephen Ministry training equips you. Stephen Ministers know that God is the cure giver; we are the care givers, bringing God's love to those suffering and fostering hope. Principals of Stewardship

- <u>The Stewardship of Time</u> "One important resource that God has given equally to all mankind is time." If we are to be successful in our support of all we, do we must be a good manager of our time. Romans 13:11 And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.
- The Stewardship of Talents "God created each person with special aptitudes; these aptitudes are referred to as talents." Talents in the early centuries were used as a means of weights and measures but can also be used as money' for example, in Matthew 25:14-30, The Parable of the Talents. Once we genuinely believe in Jesus, the Holy Spirit gifts us with the Spirit. 1 Peter 4:10 "As every man hath received a gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God." We all are stewards of the gifts and talents that God and the Holy Spirit has given to us. We will be accountable on how we utilized these gifts and talents on Judgement Day.
- <u>The Stewardship of Treasure</u> All we possess belongs to God. "It is the blessings of God that enables us to acquire material wealth. As God's people, it is important for us to remember that we are only stewards of the treasures that God has entrusted into our care." Mat 6:21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

We are all stewards of God's Time, Talents, and Treasures. He has entrusted us to diligently do this and if we succeed, we have accomplished what God has asked us to do for him: use our time, talents, and treasure to spread the Gospel for his Glory.
