STEWARDSHIP MONTH

Stewardship. This is the time of year that churches traditionally have stewardship campaigns, finance teams become very nervous, and that the “end of the year drive” to make budget is put before congregations. It is no coincidence that the Scriptures for the season are heavy on stewardship themes, and offer stories and parables about money. After all, Jesus talked about money a lot!

Stewardship, of course, is about more than money. It has become an accepted language that we give of our “time, talents, and treasures.” We give of our time in our service to the Church by volunteering in the many ministries that we have. We give of our talents, which is actually not to be understood as singing, crafting, or other gifts that we have been given, but rather as a measurement of weight used to determine the value of gold or silver for trade. So, money. And we give of our treasures, which are the Heavenly treasures that we store up: Our Christian joy, our gratitude for God’s grace in our undeserving lives, and our joy of taking care of each other, so that we may share them with the world.

Yet, what is most important in all of this is the word, “and.” Our discipleship in Christ; our call from God to the Church; our, dare I say, “duty,” is to give back freely and generously what has been entrusted to us freely and generously in our time here on earth. Note that the word “and” is there, but not the word, “or.” Our faith leads us, and compels us to give out of our abundance, in not only one or two areas, but in all three! Time, talent, and treasure” gives us a joyous opportunity to give of our whole self, and to do so out of gratitude. Here at Advent, we are interested in having a culture of generosity. Beginning in January of next year, Stewardship will be an all-year event!

“We have a Mission Spending Plan (budget) that allows for the basic operation of our building, and pays our employees, and provides for spiritual support, and offers a space for all of our wonderful ministries to flourish. Maybe it would be a service to our parishioners to nurture an atmosphere of generosity, so that we may all live with the continual joy of giving.

The next two months are historically very tense times, where financial stewardship lowers to scary levels. December, historically, offers a windfall of end-of-year giving that for most churches, takes them into positive numbers. Advent is no different, but we are going through a change. Overall, our giving numbers are down compared to past years. This may be because of the loss of some beloved members, and others who may have left our parish for one reason or another, but we have also gained new members who are giving generously of their time, talents, and treasures. God does provide! However, God provides by putting on our hearts the importance of stewarding our church and its ministries. God asks a lot from us! God also has given us everything that we need and more, and it takes all of us to look after this wonderful church. I am not just going to ask for you to give more of your “time, talents, and treasures” over the next few months. You are a very, very generous group of faithful disciples, and I have faith that the bills will be paid. What I am going to ask, in addition, is that you make stewardship of your “time, talents and treasure” an unmeasured priority in your lives all year, so that investment into our community will increase, and that God’s mission will spread through us. **“And”** is the main word. Give generously, **and** in thankful response to the grace that you have been given. Give of your “time, talents, **and** treasure.” Love God, and one another. Amen.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

September is here; children are back to school and many plans are being made to prepare for all the fall and winter activities to come. With all that said, it is also Stewardship month. It's a time of reflection on what God has blessed us with, after all, what we have has been by the grace of God.

When I think back of when George and I became a team I was quite shocked when he told me we had to give at least 10% of our income. Of course, I asked "is that gross or net?" because I was in charge of the bills. I can laugh about that now but at the time I had never heard of anyone giving that sizeable of a tithe. I never grew up with that guideline. It was always \$1, \$5 or maybe a \$10, whatever was in your wallet. But when I started making out that gift on the gross to the church, the first check I wrote each month- amazing things happened in our lives. We always had plenty to pay our bills, we never ran short, even when George was out of work for a year studying for his doctorate. When the "first gifts" each month were given there was always more available to give to other charities. Job offers continued to come in one after another when he was consulting. If you know anything about consulting, you don't have benefits like a regular job. If you don't work, you don't get paid. So, when he was "on the bench" between gigs we couldn't afford to take vacations and when he worked, he couldn't take time off to go on vacations. But it was ok. We never had to do without, and many times we had extra for "our wants". When things got tight and I would have a fleeting thought about cutting back I would think of all the blessings that got us to that point, and I was truly afraid to cut back. I just trusted that God would see us through, and He did.

Everyone has a story, this is just ours. Step out in faith that God will see you through with whatever you need if you just trust Him. I know it sounds easy but can be scary and, until you experience it, it's hard to believe.

IT IS STEWARDSHIP MONTH. LET'S LEARN MORE:

DEFINITION AND OVERVIEW:

STEWARDSHIP OF FAITH REFERS TO THE RESPONSIBLE MANAGEMENT AND NURTURING OF ONE'S FAITH IN GOD, AS WELL AS THE FAITHFUL USE OF THE SPIRITUAL GIFTS AND RESOURCES ENTRUSTED TO BELIEVERS BY GOD. THIS CONCEPT IS DEEPLY ROOTED IN THE BIBLICAL UNDERSTANDING THAT EVERYTHING A BELIEVER POSSESSES, INCLUDING THEIR FAITH, IS A GIFT FROM GOD AND SHOULD BE USED FOR HIS GLORY AND THE ADVANCEMENT OF HIS KINGDOM.

BIBLICAL FOUNDATIONS:

THE BIBLE PRESENTS STEWARDSHIP AS A FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE. IN 1 CORINTHIANS 4:2, THE APOSTLE PAUL WRITES, "NOW IT IS REQUIRED OF STEWARDS THAT THEY BE FOUND FAITHFUL." THIS VERSE UNDERSCORES THE EXPECTATION THAT BELIEVERS ARE TO BE FAITHFUL STEWARDS OF ALL THAT GOD HAS ENTRUSTED TO THEM, INCLUDING THEIR FAITH.

FAITH AS A GIFT:

FAITH ITSELF IS DESCRIBED AS A GIFT FROM GOD. EPHESIANS 2:8-9 STATES, "FOR IT IS BY GRACE YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED THROUGH FAITH, AND THIS NOT FROM YOURSELVES; IT IS THE GIFT OF GOD, NOT BY WORKS, SO THAT NO ONE CAN BOAST." THIS PASSAGE HIGHLIGHTS THAT FAITH IS NOT SELF-GENERATED BUT IS GIVEN BY GOD, EMPHASIZING THE RESPONSIBILITY TO STEWARD IT WISELY.

PARABLE OF THE TALENTS:

THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS (MATTHEW 25:14-30) IS A KEY BIBLICAL ILLUSTRATION OF STEWARDSHIP. IN THIS PARABLE, A MASTER ENTRUSTS HIS SERVANTS WITH VARYING AMOUNTS OF TALENTS (A FORM OF CURRENCY) BEFORE LEAVING ON A JOURNEY. UPON HIS RETURN, HE ASSESSES HOW EACH SERVANT HAS MANAGED WHAT WAS GIVEN TO THEM. THE FAITHFUL SERVANTS ARE REWARDED FOR THEIR DILIGENCE AND WISE MANAGEMENT, WHILE THE UNFAITHFUL SERVANT IS REPRIMANDED FOR HIS NEGLIGENCE. THIS PARABLE TEACHES THAT BELIEVERS ARE ACCOUNTABLE FOR HOW THEY USE THEIR FAITH AND RESOURCES.

FAITH IN ACTION:

JAMES 2:17 EMPHASIZES THAT FAITH MUST BE ACTIVE AND PRODUCTIVE: "SO TOO, FAITH BY ITSELF, IF IT DOES NOT RESULT IN ACTION, IS DEAD." STEWARDSHIP OF FAITH INVOLVES PUTTING ONE'S BELIEFS INTO PRACTICE THROUGH ACTS OF LOVE, SERVICE, AND OBEDIENCE TO GOD'S COMMANDS. THIS ACTIVE FAITH IS A TESTIMONY TO THE WORLD AND A MEANS OF SPIRITUAL GROWTH.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS:

BELIEVERS ARE ALSO CALLED TO STEWARD THEIR SPIRITUAL GIFTS. 1 PETER 4:10 INSTRUCTS, "AS EACH HAS RECEIVED A GIFT, USE IT TO SERVE ONE ANOTHER, AS GOOD STEWARDS OF GOD'S VARIED GRACE." THIS VERSE HIGHLIGHTS THE DIVERSITY OF GIFTS WITHIN THE BODY OF CHRIST AND THE RESPONSIBILITY TO USE THEM FOR THE BENEFIT OF OTHERS AND THE GLORY OF GOD.

CHALLENGES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

STEWARDSHIP OF FAITH INVOLVES SEVERAL CHALLENGES, INCLUDING THE TEMPTATION TO NEGLECT ONE'S SPIRITUAL LIFE, THE PRESSURES OF WORLDLY DISTRACTIONS, AND THE RISK OF BECOMING COMPLACENT. BELIEVERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO REMAIN VIGILANT AND PROACTIVE IN NURTURING THEIR FAITH THROUGH PRAYER, STUDY OF SCRIPTURE, FELLOWSHIP WITH OTHER BELIEVERS, AND PARTICIPATION IN THE SACRAMENTS.




ENCOURAGEMENT AND HOPE:

THE BIBLE OFFERS ENCOURAGEMENT TO THOSE WHO FAITHFULLY STEWARD THEIR FAITH. HEBREWS 11, OFTEN REFERRED TO AS THE "FAITH HALL OF FAME," PROVIDES EXAMPLES OF INDIVIDUALS WHO DEMONSTRATED REMARKABLE FAITHFULNESS. HEBREWS 12:1-2 URGES BELIEVERS TO "RUN WITH ENDURANCE THE RACE SET OUT FOR US, FIXING OUR EYES ON JESUS, THE AUTHOR AND PERFECTER OF OUR FAITH." THIS PASSAGE ENCOURAGES BELIEVERS TO PERSEVERE IN THEIR STEWARDSHIP, LOOKING TO JESUS AS THE ULTIMATE EXAMPLE AND SOURCE OF STRENGTH.

IN SUMMARY, STEWARDSHIP OF FAITH IS A VITAL ASPECT OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE, CALLING BELIEVERS TO RESPONSIBLY MANAGE AND GROW THEIR FAITH, UTILIZE THEIR SPIRITUAL GIFTS, AND LIVE OUT THEIR BELIEFS IN TANGIBLE WAYS. THROUGH FAITHFUL STEWARDSHIP, BELIEVERS HONOR GOD AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE ADVANCEMENT OF HIS KINGDOM.
